## Two of the Statements issued this week from the Bishops of the Six Western Dioceses, which includes Clonfert Diocese.

**1. Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation:** In so far as the Government plan currently offers no clarity about when we might expect to return to public Sacramental life in the church, we find it difficult to have any confidence that the Sacraments of First Communion and Confirmation can be celebrated before the end of the present school year. As of now, we have decided to defer the Sacrament of Confirmation for the 2021 class until the Autumn, and we encourage our parishes to consider doing the same in relation to First Holy Communion. Should the circumstances change for the better, this decision can be revisited in each diocese. In the meantime, we encourage young people and their parents to continue with the preparation. We have provided online resources to support what is being done through the Religious Education programme with the teachers in the schools.

**1. Serving the Common Good and Supporting Restrictions:** As Church leaders, we have consistently supported the public health restrictions on the grounds that they serve the common good. The state has a particular responsibility for the common good. On that basis, the Church teaches that Catholics must obey the law unless it is manifestly unjust or immoral. That does not mean that we cannot or should not speak out when we believe that something seems unfair or could be done better. We have consistently made representations, not only for the timely reopening of the public pastoral life of the Church, but also for better protection for elderly residents in nursing homes, for equity in the delivery of critical care in our hospitals and for a fair distribution of vaccines both in our own society and in the wider world.

**Tynagh & Killeen First Holy Communion 2020:** A date will be arranged for our 2020 First Holy Communion when congregations are allowed to return by the government to church. Short but reasonable notice will be given.
